

INTRODUCTION

- Wildwater canoeing or Downriver racing
- The fastest paddling sport on natural rivers
- Raced on courses **200 meters** to **several kilometers** long
- Natural rivers or artificial slalom courses
- Simple results: the racer who competes the section **the fastest wins**
- Started together with slalom during the first half of the 20th century
- Requires strength, endurance, quick reactions and experience
- Paddling between **waves**, **water cylinders**, **rocks** and other obstacles
- Classic and sprint race
- Classic is approx **20 minutes long** (maximum 60 min)
- Sprint is approx **40 to 70 seconds long**

Is long Categories: K1 men and women C1 men and women C2 men and women Team races in every category (requires 3 boats always)





ECA WILDWATER CANOEING

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STRENGTHS

- Easy to organise
- Gender equity
- **Team races**: Team races open up the possibility for weaker athletes to win medals who finished worse in the individual race (via CAN 3xC1JUN at WWC in Roudnice 2023).
- **C2 categories**: The last wild water sport that has not yet disconnected from the original roots of the boating disciplines, the most attractive category.
- **Sport in a natural environment**: organizers, athletes, coaches and entire teams work in beautiful natural places in the river valleys.
- **ECA CUPs:** a wide range of races in the ECA Cup series for juniors and seniors
- **Sprint races:** can be held on artificial canals together with slalom, freestyle and rafting races
- ICF Officials at competitions: only 3 ICF Qualified Officials needed

OPPORTUNITIES

- **Team races**: Keep the team races, because it attracts 3 to 4 athletes from each category, even 6 to 8 in C2
- Target WWC athletes and recreational paddlers
- ECA Youth Cup (age<15) as part of development
- The wildwater canoeing "lovers": there are a lot of former and less active downriver paddlers in the World who are just waiting for an impulse to get back in the game. Whether in the form of starting a club or making their own racing comeback (via team from New Zealand, Ireland)
- Northern European countries: The imaginary geographical boundary of our sport is in the northern part of Germany and the UK. However, the countries of the Baltics, and the countries of the North have far less of a problem with drying up rivers compared to Central and Southern Europe, and they also have canoeing facilities. There is potential to develop downiver.

WEAKNESSES



- Competition mainly in middle, south of Europe
- Non-cooperation with other disciplines of canoe sport: Lack of coordination in the creation of the international calendar of whitewater international races (CSL, CFR, Rafting, WWC)
- Little support from federations: due to the non-Olympic status for athletes as well as organisers
- Lack of C1 and C2 athletes: A vicious circle of low support for C disciplines of individual federations and clubs and at the same time low participation in international events and low valuation of achieved results
- **Dependence on water conditions:** dependence on water in times of drought and the operation of hydropower plants
- Little will to organize world races: decreasing number of organizational teams in federations

THREATS

- Efforts to abolish the team race: Let's not forget that all canoeing is about team not individuals, but about collective, cooperation and sharing
- **Cancellation of C2 categories**: C2 together with K1 are the founding categories of canoeing. If something in nature is threatened with extinction, we try to protect and promote it as much as possible.
- The end of composite boats: Future manufacturing problem
- Not enough coaches: especially in canoeing categories, which may lead to their complete decline
- Escalation in **costs** travel, equipment and events

- Connect and involve new ECA national federations into the WW Sport

- Increase the number of Federations with Canoe Individual and Double Racing at Club and National Level
- Introduce new club and family friendly Race
 Formats to increase participation
- International coach support

Our strengths

Our Weaknesses


- the potential for sports development in several countries due to their historical participation
- several countries with a strong wildwater base that can produce inspirational athletes and coaches
- little domestic support for non-Olympic paddling sport
- little awareness of wildwater sport in general
- lack of coaches

ACTIONS

- Communication + together training camps and competitions, exchanging paddlers, coaches, know-how, support the younger generations during the events → person to person activity
- Look into marathons, slalom, rafting and sprint divisions, get to know these people from their events, present them the WW sport, come to their country and explain, share the know-how, let them try our boats, gear + take them to our competitions → then try to find the potential coaches and also help them with the communication with their canoe federations → club to club activity
- Develop a strong club network and strengthen team working and communications between National Federations → club to federation activity
- Experiment and Share successful race formats much more widely. (The Roudnice TIP programme → needs to become a regular part of the calendar. Jamie Christie's Barrow Race format → a family-friendly race format or Jesko Klammer's September Race event in Munich such as Giant WW Slalom Race, Team Races, etc.) → organiser to organiser activity
- Joint events/meetings and teambuilding of coaches at international competitions → **organiser to person activity**
- Focus on development in countries that have exceptionally participated in international events in the last 10 years, see map on next slide for more details → organiser to federation activity

IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF OUR EVENTS AND CALENDAR

OUR PRIORITIES

- International sharing of the downriver competitions and events
- Watch out for the same dates of Juniors&U23 slalom & sprint events as well as the wildwater events
- Develop Master's Events keeping people in the sport as well as sharing and developing our club and coaching network.
- Develop Junior open events
- Support the organisers with the communication and proper feedbacks
- Preparation of racing standards for the development of new competitors as well as for gaining more attraction for spectators

ACTIONS

- Create a cloud file with the events → work on it together in the community
- Reviewing the timing of international events →
 communicate with slalom and sprint organisers, use the opportunities in autumn and spring also
- Support the Master's Championships + organise together with Junior&U23 European Championships the open race for juniors
- Creation of a forum for current and future event organisers to share experiences, technical plans and know how
- Focus on two major developmental branches that are relevant to any future event. Explanation and more information on the next slide

TIP Development Program

- equipment rental
- coaching support
- transport support at the racing venue
- inclusion of TIP competitors
- establishing links for the future
- any other help on the spot (catering/accommodation if needed)

Spectator attractiveness

- working live results
- split times on classic races (at least 2 of them)
- split times on sprint races (at least 2 of them)
- digital results screen in the racing area
- all of this above in the live stream
- 2-3 camera's views from the classic races
- 2-3 camera's views from the sprint races
- post-race interviews with the winners also in the live stream
- high quality sports photography
- good and active commentator on the site

Where and how to cut the costs for all of this above?

- → ICF and ECA medals: event organizers have to buy expensive medals from ICF and ECA, wouldn't it be better to change the medal buying policy?
- -> Concerts in the evenings on the racings days: consider whether it is worthwhile to organise an evening programme at events during race days
- -> Opening Ceremony: competitors do not enjoy long opening ceremonies, prepare a quick simple low cost program for spectators and competitors
- -> Gifts for competitors: competitors don't have to get much, they don't have to get free t-shirts, welcome gifts or anything like that. It's extra service that's easy to

DEVELOP THE PLACES TO PADDLE FOR OUR DISCIPLINE

OUR PRIORITIES

- Keep the competitions on the natural wild water
 rivers
- More races in more venues across Europe. This includes bringing in new venues and working to regain access to venues that have been lost over the last 20 years
- Increase the number of high difficulty (Grade II/IV) in wildwater races
- Increase the availability of the "Formula One" composite race boats

ACTIONS

- Brainstorm about the spring/autumn time for organizing the proper wildwater events and begin the adaptation of global warming
- Get feedback from athletes, clubs and national federations on potential new and reactivated venues for investigation - are they going to be able to organize events there? + historic venues overview
- Find new possible venues in development countries
- Develop a shared transport/ sharing/ exchange network for composite boats
- Try to distribute **the cups and championships in the form of a circuit** to limit distance differences for **sustainable reasons**

Our strengths

- using the full potential of wild water rivers
- using the artificial water courses
- helping the areas thanks to sport tourism
- light boats and paddles
- not much racing equipment is needed (like slalom gates, racing lines, etc.)

Our Weaknesses

- emerging drought and global warming
- in many cases poor access to the river and race sections (long car journeys from the finish to the start)
- possible end of composite boats
